Dear Jessica,

As you will know, the Auckland Early Music Society was wound up earlier in 2001. The final meeting decided that the funds be passed over to the Society of Recorder Players NZ Inc., being a Society with similar aims to that of Auckland Early Music Society.

As a result of discussions between the committees of the two Societies it is believed that SRPNZ agrees to the application of these monies towards the encouragement of all branches of early music, including study, research and performance by

individuals or groups, in Auckland. This is in line with the requirements of the Frank Carpay Memorial Fund which was established for this purpose, has been used over many years to make suitable grants, the funds to maintain which represent a major component of the total funds held by the A.E.M.S. Further it was requested at the winding-up meeting that in the event of the winding-up of the Society of Recorder Players, the balance of these monies should be given towards the establishment of a suitable fund to assist the study of Early Music at the University of Auckland.

There are no other beneficiaries from the winding-up of A.E.M.S. I should be grateful for your acknowledgement of this cheque, and acceptance by SRPNZ of the suggestions noted above.
